LEATHER CARE INSTRUCTIONS

General Disclaimer

If the leather feels a bit stiff right now, that's because it's just starting its journey, it'll soften over time as you use it.

Care Tips

- wipe down regularly with micro fibre cloth to remove dirt & debris
- apply leather care compound in small inconspicuous spot first before applying it to the rest of the leather
- thoroughly wipe off any excess compounds on the leather
- do not expose to direct sunlight for extended periods of time

Treat it well, and it'll remain a hardworking tool in your space for many years to come.



Tips for Industrial and Heavy-Use Leather

For shop stools, creepers, and industrial chairs, prioritize durability:

- **Frequent Dusting:** Keeps debris from grinding into the leather.
- **Reinforced Conditioning:** Apply more conditioner to high-wear areas.
- **Regular Inspections:** Check for early signs of wear to address issues promptly.



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Cleaning Leather

- Dust and Wipe:
- Use a dry, soft cloth or microfiber cloth to remove dust and loose debris.
- Use a Gentle Leather Cleaner:
- Apply a leather-specific cleaner or a mixture of mild soap and water.
- Dampen a cloth (not soaking wet) with the cleaner and gently wipe the surface.
- Test in a Small Area:
- Test any cleaner in an inconspicuous area to ensure it doesn't damage or discolor the leather.
- Wipe Off Residue:
- Use a clean, damp cloth to remove any soap or cleaner residue.
- Dry Properly:
- Pat dry with a soft towel and let the leather air dry in a shaded area, avoiding direct sunlight or heat sources.

Conditioning Leather

- Choose a Quality Leather Conditioner:
- Select a product specifically designed for your type of leather.
- Avoid wax-based or silicone-based products that may clog pores or cause buildup.
- Apply Conditioner Sparingly:
- Use a soft cloth to apply a small amount of conditioner in a thin, even layer.
- Rub in Gently:
- Work the conditioner into the leather using circular motions.
- Let it Absorb:
- Allow the conditioner to penetrate for 10–15 minutes.
- Buff the Surface:
- Use a clean, dry cloth to buff the leather for a smooth, polished finish.

Protecting and Maintaining Leather

- Protect from Moisture:
- Use a leather protector or waterproofing spray to shield against spills and stains.
- Avoid Direct Sunlight and Heat:
- Keep leather away from prolonged exposure to sunlight, heaters, or hot tools, which can cause cracking or fading.
- Clean Spills Quickly:
- Blot (not rub) any spills immediately with a dry or slightly damp cloth.
- Routine Care:
- Dust and wipe leather regularly to prevent dirt buildup.
- Condition leather every 3–6 months, or more often for heavily used items.
- Repair Minor Damage Promptly:
- Use a leather repair kit or seek professional help for scratches, cracks, or peeling.
